


HOW TO REACH "FIRENZE FIERA"

BY PLANE - **Florence International Airport** "Amerigo Vespucci" (connected to the main European cities) IATA CODE: FLR www.aeroporto.firenze.it

It is located at **4 km (2.5 miles)** from Florence and it can be reached by taxi (20 minutes) or by the shuttle bus "Vola in bus", a special connection service from/to the Vespucci Airport and the Santa Maria Novella train station, jointly run by ATAF and SITA. Pisa International Airport "Galileo Galilei" (connected to the main European cities)IATA CODE: PSA www.pisa-airport.it

It is located in Pisa, at **60 km (38 miles)** from Florence and it can be reached in 1 hour by train from the Santa Maria Novella train station, in Florence: three trains every hour for Pisa C.le and Pisa Airport from 06.00 a.m. to 10.00 p.m.

BY CAR - An efficient motorway network connects Florence to the rest of Italy and Europe. Firenze Fiera is just at 4 km (2.5 miles) from the main Italian motorway (the A1: Autostrada del Sole - Exit Firenze Nord). Two large parking areas, respectively for 600 and 800 cars, are just 100 meters away; another parking area for 400 cars can be reached by bus.

BY TRAIN - There are 4 train stations in Florence:


- Santa Maria Novella Central Station: 80/100 meters from the "Palazzo dei Congressi" and from the "Palazzo degli Affari", 50 meters from the "Fortezza da Basso" covering the access to railroad 16.
- Rifredi: approximately 2 km (1.2 miles) away
- Campo di Marte: 1,5 km ca.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION - All town busses stop at "Piazza della Stazione" (Santa Maria Novella train station). Since they are just 50 meters far from the Santa Maria Novella train station, Firenze Fiera's venues are within walking distance of any bus stop. In addition, a large number of bus services connect the centre of Florence to its surroundings (Fiesole: ataf bus no. 7 - Settignano: Ataf bus no. 10). The regional coach lines (Cap, Lazzi, Sita) connect Florence to the other wonderful Tuscan cities such as San Gimignano, Pienza, Arezzo, Volterra, Forte dei Marmi, etc.



The overall theme for this Conference is "Cytokines and Interferons: from the bench to the bedside". We are excited about the prospect of hosting up to 1000 international and local participants at this Joint Meeting in Florence. An outstanding international schedule consisting of Plenary Sessions, Symposia, Workshops, and Poster Sessions has been arranged to bring together leading research workers in cytokine biology, cancer, immunology, virology and infectious diseases in a forum that emphasizes the intersection of these expanding fields.

The topics at this conference will cover a full spectrum from basic science to clinical, biotechnological and pharmaceutical research. Research in this area of immunology has been directly responsible for the development of growth factors and their application in hematology, for new treatments in oncology, for a new generation of anti-inflammatory drugs, and for treatments for multiple sclerosis, hepatitis and viral syndromes.

Leading scientists have already agreed to participate in this conference.

The International Advisory Committee is committed to focusing on bio-

medical advancements and their application in the areas of inflammation, infectious diseases, oncology, neurology and immunology.

The program emphasis is on integrating the major themes of the Conference, and to provide molecular insights into the development of innovative therapies for human disease.

Scientific themes range from new cytokines and new technologies, to the roles of cytokines in tumor immunology, cell cycle control, inflammation, host defense, and angiogenesis.

The clinical impact of cytokines in cancer, inflammatory diseases, viral syndromes and the use of cytokines as therapeutics will also be a major focus of the meeting. Fundamental research topics will include signal transduction, apoptosis, gene regulation, and cytokine structure-function.

Scientists in academic institutions, biotechnology, and pharmaceutical industries will be represented as plenary speakers. Senior scientists, young investigators, physician-scientists, post-doctoral fellows, and students will all benefit from the perspectives that are brought together at this unique international conference.
